This series of lectures about themes in the History of the Olympics will begin the programme cycle and is aimed at the Queen Mary community, administrators of the Games, east London community leaders, schools.

They will present new and exciting research and analyse the History of the Games in an elegant lecture format. The themes include recurrent challenges to the Games (the weight of history, impact on the built environment), as well as unique configurations (boycotts, natural disasters). 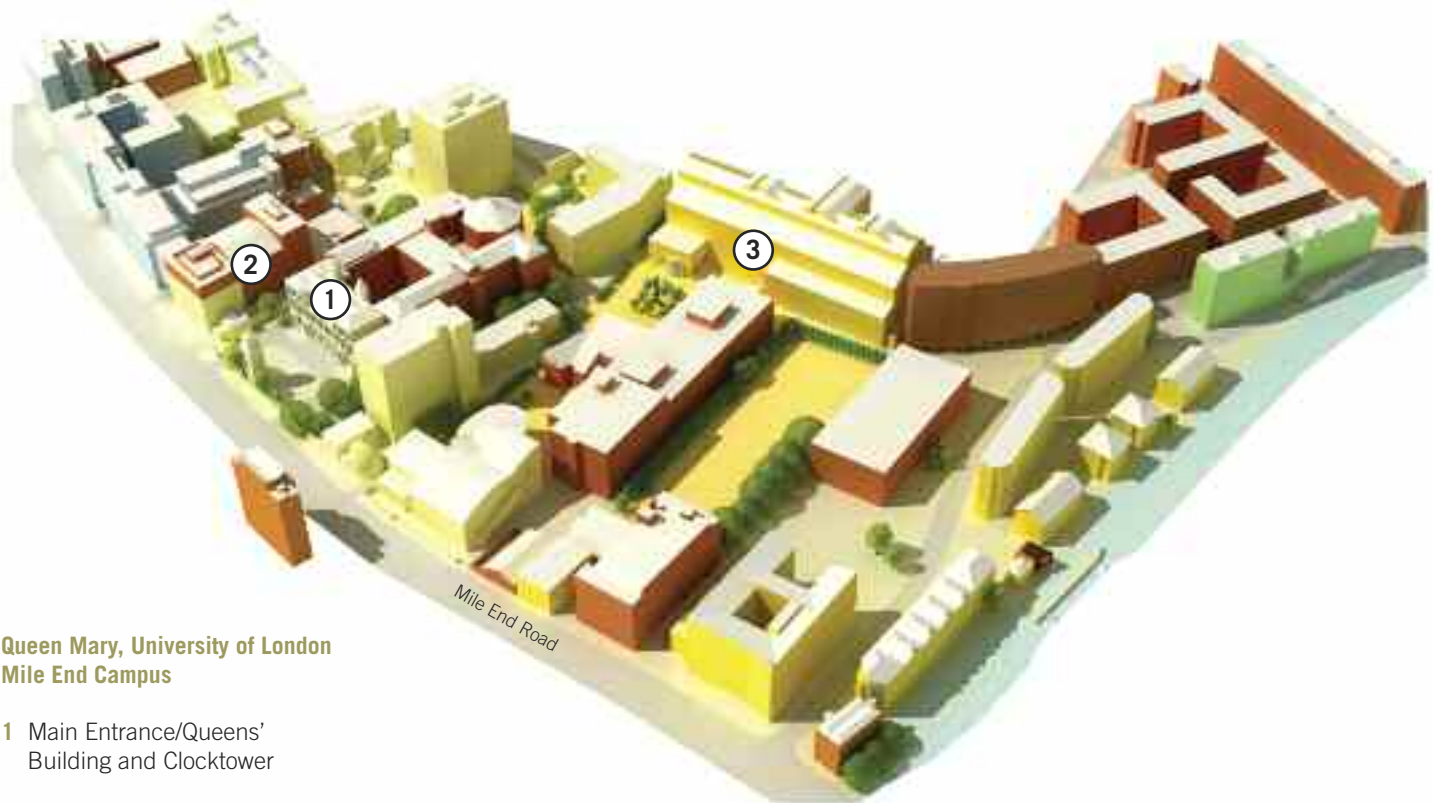
